SERVING STUDENTS AND THEIR FAMILIES IS AS EASY AS 2-1-1


Among Oklahoma's most valuable resources are the numerous organizations committed to serving the community. Unfortunately, many of the persons in need do not utilize these resources because they do not know about the services that are available to them. This is the situation Oklahoma's 2-1-1 call centers seek to correct.

According to director Lori Linstead, "2-1-1 is an easy to remember telephone number that connects callers to information about critical community services for their everyday needs and in times of disaster. 2-1-1 provides a telephone number to call free of charge 24 hours a day 7 days a week. 2-1-1 has professionally trained

specialists to assess callers' needs with translation services available in many languages. Simply dial 2-1-1 from your landline or cell phone from anywhere in Oklahoma. 2-1-1 is the direct link between people who need help and those who provide help."

While 2-1-1 is best known for assisting the poor and those affected by natural disasters, it is also a valuable resource for educators. Students often turn to teachers. counselors. coaches, and administrators when they have problems. 2-1-1 can help educators to give informed advice and to connect students or parents with groups that can provide ongoing, material assistance. With a database of approximately 2,000 agencies, 2-1-1 call centers are prepared to assist with nearly every problem - academic, emotional, financial, or health-related. They are also a great resource for schools looking to find ways to ac-

commodate students with disabilities. Best of all, the 2-1-1 call centers expand the educator's toolkit without
